A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF LUMSDEN TO PROVIDE FOR NUMBERING OF HOUSES AND OTHER BUILDINGS LOCATED WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS

The Council of the Town of Lumsden in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

- That all houses and other buildings located in the Town of Lumsden be numbered according to the attached plan marked as Exhibit "A" to this bylaw.
- 2. That for the purpose of future subdivisions, that provision is hereby made to allow for a numbering system established according to Exhibit "A" and providing for numbering of properties as described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto.

## TOWN OF LUMSDEN

## STREET NUMBERING SYSTEM

- James Street and Qu'Appelle Drive are deemed to be major thoroughfares thus dividing the town into quarters; therefore all numberable lots or division of lots begin at these streets with "O" being the intersection of the two.
- 2. Streets running East and West have the North side in even numbers and the South side in odd numbers beginning at James Street.
- 3. Streets running North and South have utilized a block designation North of the tracks because of having numbered avenues. The 100 Block of the north/south streets is between First and Second Avenues beginning at the South end and working North. Streets South of Qu'Appelle Drive running north/south start at "O" from Qu'Appelle Drive.
- 3. The Crescents start at "O" and continue without interruptions from West to East. The West side is even and the East side is odd.
- 4. All numbers are in intervals of "5" so that future divisions of properties can be accommodated.
- 5. Lots will be numbered according to the street on which the main building faces.
