The Government of Saskatchewan is committed to the safety and security of senior citizens. The Ministry of Government Relations is helping achieve this with the Seniors Home Security Program. This program supports low-income seniors (with a net household income of \$35,000 or less) and seniors who have been a victim of a break and enter or home invasion.

The Seniors Home Security Program offers deadbolts, door viewers, smoke alarms, smoke alarm batteries, and carbon monoxide detectors. The program will also provide installation of these items and a security assessment of their home, at no charge to the senior.

As we enter our second year, we are looking for your assistance to promote and facilitate the use of the program. Please find enclosed a pamphlet package of information for your review. Our office would be happy to supply more packages for distribution to seniors (age 65 and older) in your community. The pamphlet package contains the program information, application form and a prepaid return envelope for convenience.
