**Modified Work Hours Policy** 

Effective:

August 28, 2024 (on a one-year trial basis)

Approved by the RM of Lumsden No. 189 on September 5, 2024

Amended:

#### Purpose:

The intent of this policy is to provide an opportunity for an employee of the Lumsden Municipal Office to request modified work hours, per the policy details below.

#### **Definitions:**

Administrator: Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) of the municipality.

<u>Employee:</u> shall refer to all persons hired by the Municipality, who receive wages or salaries from the Municipality and work in the municipal office.

<u>Modified Work Hours</u>: Daily work hours that have been adjusted from the established hours but continue to total thirty-five (35) regular hours per week.

Municipality: Town of Lumsden.

#### **Guiding Principles:**

- Section 3.12 of the Town of Lumsden Human Resource Policy Manual refers to the regular number of working hours. It states:
  - <u>Permanent full-time employee:</u> shall refer to any employee working a regular number of hours equal to or exceeding 35 hours per week.
- Section 18.1 of the Town of Lumsden Human Resource Policy Manual refers to Hours of Work. It states:
  - Office Personnel and Office Management (7 hours per day): The regular hours of workers in this category shall be determined by the Administrator.
- It is recognized that, at the time of this policy's creation, the Chief Administrative Officer has
  determined the regular work hours for employees of the Lumsden Municipal Office to be 8:00 am
  to 4:00 pm (including a 30-minute unpaid lunch break and 30 minutes banked toward an earned
  day off).

#### Policy:

- 1. Employees may submit a request to their Department Manager to modify their working hours (without accumulating overtime). For example, 7:00 am to 3:00 pm, or 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.
- The Department Manager, in consultation with the Chief Administrative Officer, will review the request and determine if a fair and equitable schedule for all employees in their department can be established.
- 3. It is recognized that modified work hour schedules will differ for each department based on their duties and responsibilities.
- 4. If a fair and equitable schedule can be established, all employees in a department will be given the opportunity to participate in the "Modified Work Hours".
- 5. Once the CAO has approved a modified work hour schedule, it is the responsibility of the Department Manager to implement and moderate the schedule.
- 6. It is essential that fellow employees are not adversely impacted by a modified work hour schedule.
- 7. It is essential that customer service and operational efficiencies are not negatively impacted by any modified work hour schedule.



# TOWN OF LUMSDEN BYLAW 2024-10 A BYLAW FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING WASTE DISPOSAL TIPPING FEES

1. The Council of the Town of Lumsden, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

The waste disposal tipping fees stated below apply to all authorized users of the Lumsden Solid Waste Facility (Lumsden Landfill).

MIXED LOADS	
Pickup Truck or Small Utility Trailer	\$ 20.00 per load
1 Ton Commercial Truck or Large Utility Trailer	\$ 40.00 per load
2 Ton Truck & Over	\$120.00 per load
*Special Services Fee	\$250.00 per load

Other Items	
Items with Refrigerant	\$10.00 each
Propane Tanks	\$10.00 each

#### Mixed Loads include the following waste:

- Household waste that is not contained in bags
- Carpet, furniture, mattresses, burning barrels, shingles, insulation, etc.
- Bulk refuse (incl. concrete mixed with wood, metal or plastic rubble)
- Wood, metals and recyclables that are not sorted for disposal in specified designated areas
- Wood that is not clean of nails, contaminants, OSB, etc.

The Town, through the Public Works Superintendent, Landfill Attendant or their designate, reserves the right to refuse permission to deposit any part of or all of the refuse brought to the landfill site, if, in the judgment of the Public Works Superintendent or their designate, the material in question does not meet the requirements specified in the Landfill Operations Plan.

#### Waste Exempt from Tipping Fees:

- Bagged waste
- Lawn and garden vegetation
- Recyclables, such as clean wood and metal, sorted and disposed in specified designated areas

#### \*Special Services Fee:

The special services fee may apply to any user at the discretion of the Public Works Superintendent or their designate, when waste being disposed requires special attention from the Public Works Department.

2. That Bylaw No. 04-2017 is hereby repealed.

#### 3. Effective Date

This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the final day of its passing.

#### **BYLAW NO. 2024-11**

# A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE OPERATION OF VEHICLES IN THE TOWN OF LUMSDEN

The Council of the Town of Lumsden, in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

#### 1. SHORT TITLE

(a) This bylaw shall hereinafter be referred to as the "Traffic Bylaw".

#### 2. INTERPRETATION

In this Bylaw:

- (a) "abandoned vehicle" means a vehicle that has been left or placed on a street, public place or land or building owned or controlled by the Town of Lumsden for 10 days or more; and after reasonable inquiry, the owner of the vehicle cannot be ascertained;
- (b) "angle parking" means the parking of vehicles with the right front wheel drawn up to the curb on the right-hand side of the highway, or at distance of not more than thirty (30) centimeters from such curb, thevehicle to be placed at an angle of forty-five (45) degrees with the curb;
- (c) "Administrator" means the administrator of the Town of Lumsden;
- (d) "boulevard" means the area between the travelled portion of the highway and limit of the highway right-of-way, but does not include agravel shoulder;
- (e) "Council" means the Council of the Town of Lumsden;
- (f) "curb" means the lateral boundaries of a roadway, whether or notmarked by curbing;
- (g) "designated officer" means the Administrator, Royal Canadian Mounted Police or a person appointed by Council to enforce municipal bylaws;
- (h) "Fire Chief" means the fire chief for the Town of Lumsden and anyone acting or authorized by the Fire Chief to act in his behalf;
- (i) "heavy vehicle" means a vehicle with or without load which alone or together with any trailer, semi-trailer or other vehicle being towed, weighs 4.5 tonnes (4500 kg.) or more;
- (j) "highway" means a road allowance or a road, street or lane vested inthe Crown in right of Saskatchewan or set aside for the purpose of theCrown in right of Saskatchewan pursuant to any Act, and includes anything erected on or in connection with the highway, and does not include a provincial highway within the municipality as designated pursuant to the provisions of *The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997*;
- (k) "intersection" means the area contained within the straight production of the lateral curb lines, or, in the absence of curb lines, ofthe lateral boundary lines, of two or more highways that join one another at an angle, whether or not one of those highways crosses the other;
- (I) "lug vehicle" means any vehicle, portable engine or traction engine having metal spikes, lugs or cleats projecting from the face of the wheels or tires thereof, or having metal track tread;
- (m) "municipality" means the Town of Lumsden;

- (n) "one-way highway" means highway as described to it by The Traffic Safety Act;
- (o) "parade" means any procession of more than ten (10) pedestrians or of more than six (6) vehicles moving upon any highway, except funeral processions;
- (p) "parallel parking" means the parking of a vehicle with both right wheels thereof drawn up to the curb on the right-hand side of the highway, or at a distance of not more than thirty (30) centimeters from such curb;
- (q) "park", "parking", have the meanings described thereto by *The Traffic Safety Act;*
- (r) "pedestrian" means any person afoot;
- (s) "pedestrian crosswalk" means a clearly marked pedestrian crossing, by signs and/or lines;
- (t) "place of public assembly" means schools, theatres, moving picture theatres, churches, hockey and skating rinks, curling rinks, dance hallsand public assembly halls;
- (u) "power turn" means to maneuver a vehicle in such a manner to cause part of the vehicle to depart from its ordinary line of progressby the sudden use of acceleration and/or braking;
- (v) "private roadway" means any private road, private driveway, lane ramp or other means of vehicle access to or egress from a building orstructure and it may include part of a parking lot;
- (w) "sidewalk" means that portion of a boulevard which is paved, bricked or otherwise hard surfaced and intended for the use of pedestrians;
- (x) "sign" means any sign, curb or sidewalk marking, or other deviceplaced or erected on a highway for the purpose of regulating, warning, guiding traffic or providing information;
- (y) "speed zone" means any portion of a highway within the Town of Lumsden, as designated herein, and identified by a sign erected andmaintained at each end thereof, indicating the maximum speed applicable thereto;
- **"stop or stopping"** means the halting of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict in compliance with the directions of a police officer or of a traffic control sign or signal;
- (aa) "tow away zone" means a designated area on a highway where parking is prohibited and where stopped or parked vehicles will besubject to removal and impoundment;
- **(bb) "town supervisor"** means the public works supervisor or the assistant or anyone acting or authorized by the municipality to act on their behalf;
- (cc) "u-turn" means the turning of a vehicle so as to cause it to proceed in the opposite direction from which it was proceeding immediately prior to the commencement of such turn;
- **(dd) "vehicle"** means a vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer or a vehicle asdescribed to it by The Traffic Safety Act.

## 3. SCOPE

(a) "STOP" STREETS

The highways as listed in **Appendix 1** are designated as "Stop" streets.

(b) "YIELD" STREETS

The highways as listed in **Appendix 2** are designated as "Yield" streets.

#### 4. INFRACTIONS

#### (a) "STOP" STREETS

The provisions of The Traffic Safety Act shall apply to all traffic approaching and facing a "Stop" sign erected and maintained in accordance with the provisions of Section 5(a).

## (b) "YIELD" STREETS

The Provisions of The Traffic Safety Act shall apply to all traffic approaching and facing a "Yield" sign erected and maintained inaccordance with the provisions of Section 5(b).

## (c) MISCELLANEOUS SIGNS

- (1) No person shall, except where authorized by resolution of Council or when duly authorized by law, erect immediately adjacent to any highway; any sign, marker, signal or light or any advertising sign or device.
- (2) No person shall deface, damage, destroy or remove any sign or marker erected pursuant to this bylaw.

#### (d) SCHOOL BUS FLASHING LIGHTS

- (1) Subject to subsection (2), the operator of a school bus when operating a school bus on public highways in the municipality shall not activate the safety lights.
- (2) The provision of subjection (1) shall not apply at the locations listed in **Appendix 3**.

#### (e) LUG VEHICLES

- (1) No person shall propel, operate or drive any lug vehicle upon any highway within the municipality without first having obtained of the Administrator, a permit in writing authorizing same.
- (2) The Administrator is hereby authorized to issue permits in writing for the purpose of section 4(e)(1) of this bylaw in any case where the applicant therefore has signed a written undertaking in
  - **Form 1**, **Appendix 4**. Provided that the Administrator shall notissue any such permit unless he is satisfied that with reasonablecare in operation, the lug vehicle may be propelled or driven over any highway without damage resulting thereto or to any bridge or culvert thereon.
- (3) Nothing contained in section 4(e)(1) shall be deemed to preclude the transport of a lug vehicle as herein defined over any highway where same is being carried by means of a rubber-tired trailer or other conveyance equipped with rubber tires.

#### (f) PARKING

- (1) Except as otherwise provided herein, the parking of vehicles ispermitted on all highways within the municipality.
- (2) (i) subject to the provisions of subsection (ii) no person shall park a vehicle on any lane, or on any street so as to obstruct the entrance to any lane or to a driveway or approach leading to a private premises.
  - (ii) notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (i), a vehicle may be parked in any lane for the purpose of taking on or discharging cargo, provided no such vehicleshall be so parked for a period exceeding thirty (30) minutes at one time, unless written permission has first been obtained from the Administrator or a designated officer of the municipality for any extension of such timelimit.
- (3) (i) subject to subsection (ii), every person parking a vehicleupon a highway within the municipality where parking is permitted, shall parallel park same;

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- $(ii)\;$  every person parking a vehicle upon a highway listed in  $\mbox{\bf Appendix 5}$  shall angle park same.
- (4) Subject to subsection (i), no person shall park a vehicle in any "No Parking" area as designated in **Appendix 6**, at any time, whether such areas are marked on the curb or otherwise signs erected and maintained in accordance with the provisions of section 5(d) to indicate that therein prohibited parking.
  - (i) During a wedding or funeral ceremony, any church or other place of public assembly may in coordination with the Town Supervisor, erect signsor parking barricades to designate a <u>temporary parking area</u> in front of the place of public assembly.
- (5) No person shall park a vehicle within five (5) meters of any street intersection.
- (6) No person shall park a vehicle within three (3) meters of any fire hydrant.
- (7) Subject to subsection (i) No person shall park a vehicle on a highway at one place for any period of time exceeding twenty-four (24) consecutive hours.
  - (i) Privately owned and fully licensed recreation camper trailers may be parked on the street in residential areas from April 1 to October 31 of each year, provided that they are parked adjacent to the owner's property and parked for a period not to exceed seventy-two (72) consecutive hours.
- (8) No person shall park any vehicle in any private parking place or on any private property unless he is the owner, occupant, licensee or permittee of the parking place or private property, except with the consent of such owner, occupant, licensee or permittee.
- (9) (i) subject to subsection (ii), no person shall park any vehicle designated for carrying or intended for the carrying of oil, so gasoline or other inflammable, combustible or explosive material, within 30 metersfrom any building in the municipality used or
  - intended for use, in whole or in part, as a place ofdwelling, a hotel or place of public assembly.
  - (ii) nothing in subsection (i) shall be deemed to restrict the parking of any such vehicle for such period of time as may be necessary to take on or discharge cargo.
- (10) No person shall park a vehicle with a manufacturer's rated capacity in excess of 4.5 tonnes (4,500 kg) on any streets or avenues designated in **Appendix 7**.
- (11) No person shall park an unregistered vehicle on any street, avenue, lane or any public land, which includes a right of way or boulevard.
- (12) No person shall park a vehicle with a sign attached indicating that the vehicle is for sale on any public lands, including but not limited to a highway, that are not designated for that purpose.
- (13) No person shall park a vehicle on any highway unless on the right hand side of the highway having regard for which direction the vehicle had been proceeding.
- (14) No person shall park a vehicle so as to obstruct any portion of a sidewalk.
- (15) No person shall park a vehicle so as to obstruct the movement of traffic.
- (16) No person shall park so as to obstruct any portion of a pedestrian crosswalk.



- (17) Where a sign has been erected indicating that stopping is prohibited, no person shall park or stop a vehicle on a highway designated prohibited stopping as described in **Appendix 12**.
- (18) Where a sign(s) has been erected indicating that parking is prohibited and the area is designated as a "tow away zone", noperson shall park or stop a vehicle on a highway designated as "No Parking-Tow Away Zone" as described in **Appendix 17.**

#### (g) POWER TURNS

The operator of a vehicle shall not execute "power turns" on anyhighway in the municipality.

#### (h) SNOWMOBILES

- (1) Under the provisions of The Snowmobile Act, [and subject to section (h) (2)], it shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 12 midnight on any highwayexcept Provincial Highway Nos. 11 and 20 within the limits of the municipality.
- (2) Notwithstanding section (h) (1) of this bylaw, it shall be lawfulto operate a snowmobile on the portion of Provincial HighwayNos. 11 and 20 for the purpose of crossing the provincial highway.

#### (i) SPEED

- (1) Subject to subsection (2), no person shall operate a vehicle in the municipality at a speed greater than forty (40) km/h.
- (2) No person shall operate a vehicle at a speed greater than thirty (30) km/h in speed zones as set out in **Appendix 8**.

#### (j) U-TURNS

(1) No person shall cause a vehicle to make a U-Turn between intersections, and at the intersection of a highway with a lane or malley in the municipality.

#### (k) WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS – TRUCK ROUTES

- (1) Subject to subsection (2) No person shall operate a vehicle or combination of vehicles with a gross vehicle weight exceeding 10,000 kg on any public highway within the Town of Lumsdenwith the following exceptions:
  - Allowed Travel on James Street North Maximum 5 axle vehicle combination and a maximum gross weight of 34,500 kgs.
  - Heavy Vehicle Route as listed in Appendix 9. –Maximum axle and gross vehicle weights for secondary highways as set out in the Saskatchewan Vehicle and Dimension Regulations 1999.
- (2) Subsection (1) shall not apply to vehicles owned and operated by the municipality or issued a daily, weekly, monthly or annual permit from the Administrator or a duly authorized representative, for the purpose of making deliveries on any highway in the municipality, provided that the operator of the vehicles(s) uses the most direct route from and to the heavy vehicle route, as listed in **Appendix 9**.
- (3) That the municipality shall by resolution of Council be allowed to establish and revise the permit fee mentioned in section 4(k)(2).
- (4) The provisions of *The Police Act* and *The Highways and Transportation Act* shall apply to the operators of vehicles referred to in subsections (1) and (2).

## (I) VEHICLES ON PUBLIC & MUNICIPAL RESERVES, PUBLIC PARKS, PUBLIC PLACES, ETC.

- (1) No person may operate or park a vehicle on any areas designated in **Appendix 10**.
- (2) The provision of subsection (1) shall not apply to maintenancevehicles or vehicles using a designated parking area or vehicles being operated by a member of the police force, designated officer or other persons appointed by Council while engaging in their duties or person(s) having been given writtenpermission from the Administrator of the municipality.

#### (m) BICYCLES

- (1) No person shall operate a bicycle without having at least one hand on the handlebar.
- (2) No person shall operate a bicycle on a sidewalk.
- (3) No person shall operate a bicycle with a passenger ("doubling").

#### (n) "EMERGENCY CONTROL MEASURES"

- (1) A designated officer is hereby authorized to direct traffic in conformity with the provisions of this bylaw and *The Traffic Safety Act*.
- (2) In case of fire or other emergency, or in order to expedite traffic, or safeguard pedestrians, or prevent accidents, or meet any unforeseen conditions, a designated officer or fire chief of the municipality is hereby authorized to direct traffic in such a manner as he/she may deem necessary whether or not in conformity with the provisions of this Bylaw or The *Traffic Safety Act*.

#### (o) "TEMPORARY CLOSING AND PARKING"

- (1) (a) Any portion of a public highway may be temporarily closed to vehicular traffic by a designated officer or the Town Supervisor in order that pedestrians may have the exclusive use thereof.
  - (b) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Bylaw, a designated officer shall have authority to temporarily prevent parking on any highway or portion thereofwhenever in his/her judgement it may be necessary in order to avoid traffic congestion, danger or accident.
  - (c) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Bylaw, the Town Supervisor shall have authority to temporarily prevent parking and/or prohibit traffic on any highway or portion thereof to allow any work to be carried out byor on behalf of the Municipality, such work to include, but not be restricted to the snow removal, cleaning, repairing or maintenance of such highway.
  - (d) No person driving a vehicle shall drive through or enterupon any street or portion thereof, which is roped, barricaded or indicated, by notice or sign as beingclosed under the authority of a designated officer or the Town Council.
  - (e) No person shall park a vehicle on any highway orportion thereof on which parking has been temporarily prohibited by a designated officer or the TownSupervisor under the provisions of subsections (b) and
    - (c) of this Section.
- (2) On days when school is in session, the Lumsden Elementary School and the Lumsden High School are permitted to prevent all vehicular traffic from accessing Broad Street from 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue to 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and to prevent access to Broad Street at the intersection of Broad Street and 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue from 15:15 to 15:30. It is the schools' responsibility to place and remove traffic barriers, such as traffic cones, during this 15-minute period.



## (p) PARADES

- (1) No parade shall be held in the Municipality without the writtenpermission first had and obtained from the Town of Lumsden who shall designate or approve hour and route of the parade. Any person desiring to hold a parade shall apply to the Town ofLumsden in writing in **Form 1 Appendix 13** for a permit therefore not less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time setfor the commencement of the parade and shall give full particulars thereof.
- (2) The Administrator is hereby authorized to issue permits in writing for the purpose of subsection (p)(1) of this bylaw **Form 2 Appendix 13** and may impose directions or conditions as totime, route or otherwise.

#### (q) RESTRICTED PARKING

(1) No person shall stop or park a vehicle in an area designated as restricted parking without a valid parking permit. Permits must be properly displayed on the rear-view mirror of the vehicle for that designated area. Permits may be obtained from the Lumsden MunicipalOffice at a cost of \$60.00 per year, per space, and expire December 31st of each year. Designated restricted areas are described in **Appendix 14**.

#### (r) ACCESSIBLE PARKING

(1) No person shall stop or park a vehicle in an area designated as accessible parking as described in **Appendix 15** without a valid parking permit properly displayed in the front windshield. The temporary or permanent placard must be issued by the Saskatchewan Abilities Council and have a valid permit number and expiry date.

#### 5. SIGNS

- (a) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at all stop streets listed in **Appendix**1, at a distance of approximately three (3) meters from point of intersection, an appropriate sign containing the word "Stop", so placed to face the traffic approaching the intersection.
- (b) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at all yield streets listed in **Appendix** 2 at a distance of approximately three (3) meters from point of intersection, an appropriate sign containing the word "Yield", so placed to face the traffic approaching the intersection.
- (c) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at all "No Parking" areas as listed in **Appendix 6 and Appendix 7**, appropriate signs and/or curb markings. Such signs or curb markings shall be visible from that part of the highway to which the restriction applies.
- (d) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at all "Restricted Parking" areas as listed in **Appendix 14**, appropriate signs and/or curbmarkings. Such signs or curb markings shall be visible from that part of the highway to which the restriction applies.
- (e) Council shall cause to be erected and maintained at all "Accessible Parking" areas as listed in **Appendix 15**, appropriate signs and/or curbmarkings. Such signs or curb markings shall be visible from that part of the highway to which the restriction applies.
- (f) Council may, by resolution, provide for the erection and maintenance on any highway and at any designated point or points thereon, of suchsigns as it may deem expedient for warning, guidance, directions or information thereon.
- (g) The Administrator, in co-operation with the Town Public Works Foreman, shall maintain a schedule of traffic signs (including warningand information signs) locations in the Town of Lumsden and shall ensure that the schedule is open to public inspection.

#### 6. PENALTIES

#### (a) SIGNS AND PARADES

Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of subsections 4(c)(1), 4(c)(2) and 4(p)(1) of this bylaw is guilty of an offence or liableon summary conviction to the penalties provided in the General PenaltyBylaw of the Town of Lumsden.

#### (b) LUG VEHICLES, POWER TURNS AND U-TURNS

Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of subsections 4(e)(1), 4(g) and 4(j)(1) of this bylaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of:

(1)	Subsection 4(e)(1)	\$100.00
(2)	Subsection 4(j)(1)	\$50.00
(3)	Subsection 4(g)	\$100.00

#### (c) PARKING

- (1) A police officer, designated officer or any other person appointed to carry out the provision of this bylaw, upon discovery of avehicle in contravention of this bylaw may place a parking infraction notice on the vehicle.
- (2) Where a parking infraction notice is placed on a vehicle by a police officer, designated officer or any other person appointed to carryout the provisions of this bylaw, the owner;
  - i. May pay the early payment as indicated on theparking infraction notice; or
  - ii. Shall pay the set fine as indicated on the parkinginfraction notice; or
  - iii. Exercise Option 2 on the reverse side of the parkinginfraction notice, regarding appeal.
- (3) A Notice of Violation shall be in **Form 1**, **Appendix 11**, attached to and forming part of this bylaw or a Provincial Summary Offence Ticket.
- (4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of section 4(f)of this bylaw or fails to comply with any notice or order given there under shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction, shall be liableto penalties as set out in **Appendix 16**, or under the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.

#### (d) WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

- (1) A person who contravenes the provisions of subsections 4(k)(1) and/or 4(k)(2) is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a penalty of not more than \$500.00 for the first and subsequent offence.
- (2) A further penalty shall be imposed as follows:
  - (i) three dollars for each 50 kg or fraction thereof for the first 1,000 kg in excess of the prescribed maximum gross weight allowable; and
  - (ii) five dollars for each 50 kg or fraction thereof in excess of 1,000 kg that the actual gross weight exceeds the prescribed gross weight allowable, provided that in computing the further penalty, 500 kg or two per cent of the maximum gross weight fixed by this bylaw, whichever is the lesser, shall not be taken into account.
- (3) In each instance, the total fine shall not exceed the maximum provided for in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Town of Lumsden.

#### (e) BICYCLES

The penalty for the contravention of sections 4(m)(1), 4(m)(2) and 4(m)(3) is as follows:

(1) for the first infraction impounding the bicycle for seven (7) days;

(2) for the second or additional infractions impounding the bicycle for fourteen (14) days.

## (f) IMPOUNDMENT

The registered owner of a vehicle is responsible for the costs of removaland impoundment.

#### 7. REMOVAL & IMPOUNDMENT

- (a) Any member of the police force, designated officer or other person appointed by Council may remove or cause to be removed any vehiclethat is unlawfully placed, left or kept on any street or lane, public parking place, or other public place, or on municipally owned property, and to impound or store such vehicle.
- (b) Any member of the police force, designated officer or other person appointed by Council may remove or cause to be removed any vehicleon request of the owner, occupant, licensee or permittee of a parking place or private land and to impound or store such vehicle.
- (c) Where a vehicle has been impounded or stored after it has been removed under subsection (a) or (b), it may be retained at a place designated by Council for a period of thirty (30) days from date of removal unless the cost of removal, impounding and storage are soonerpaid. Upon payment of the full costs herein, the vehicle may be released to the owner thereof.
- (d) If the costs of removal, impounding and storage are not paid within theperiod of thirty days as specified in subsection (c), the municipality shall have the right to recover same from the owner of the vehicle by:
  - (1) legal action in a court of competent jurisdiction;
  - (2) sale by public auction on publication of a notice designating thetime and place of sale at least 14 days prior to the sale in a newspaper circulating in the municipality and on sending suchnotice by registered mail to the owner at the address appearing on the last registration of the vehicle.

## 8. ABANDONED VEHICLES

Abandoned vehicles shall be dealt with as provided under Section 371 of *The Municipalities Act*.

## 9. REPEAL OF BYLAWS

Bylaw No. 2023-12 is hereby repealed.

#### 10. COMING INTO FORCE

This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of final passingthereof.
